Whilst the SESF was not able to award scholarships in 2020, due to the cancellation of school sports, the SESF ramped up mentor and mentee activities to strengthen relationships and continue to give connection, focus and hope to our students.

Our students have emerged from the year with a renewed outlook for 2021, as they return to their training and competitions and once again focus on their sporting dreams.

Through the ongoing support of our fund partners, the SESF will continue its financial and mentoring support of these inspiring young Victorian students into 2021, and beyond.

Sports Excellence Scholarship Fund Chair Report for 2020

The Sports Excellence Scholarship Fund invests in the future of Australian sport by supporting talented young athletes in the pursuit of their sporting dream. Now in its ninth year the SESF continued to grow its reach and profile in spite of the challenges of the Covid-19 year. Building on steps taken in 2019 the SESF now operates independently whilst still maintaining a strong relationship with School Sport Victoria (SSV), the vehicle through which our funding is channelled.

The SESF is an incorporated body with Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) status.

The fund was not able to award any scholarships in 2020 as all school sport was cancelled. Instead we focused on a mentoring program for students who had previously been awarded scholarships. Guided by board member Nathan Burke the mentoring team was upskilled to support their mentees and careful governance was provided by adhering to the Child Safe policy, mentoring policy and working with children police checks.
