EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

This year has been another record-breaking one for the Sports Excellence Scholarship Fund (SESF) as we continue to support talented young athletes across Australia. We are proud to have awarded **255 scholarships** to emerging athletes, smashing our goal of 230, from a total of 1,700 applications. This doubling in demand reflects the expanding reach and reputation of SESF and highlights the pressing need for greater access to financial support in sport.

SESF remains dedicated to supporting accessibility in sport for all Australians, including those from underrepresented communities. In 2024, we awarded scholarships to 42 Indigenous athletes, 46 Para-athletes, 65 regional athletes, and 29 remote athletes. These figures underscore our commitment to building a diverse sporting community and empowering athletes who face additional financial and logistical barriers.

Our partnerships have been crucial in making this impact possible. We are deeply grateful to our enduring supporters, including the MCC Foundation, The Phillips Foundation, New Balance, Bunnings, RACV, ASCA several dedicated philanthropists and many other financial partners.

This year's major events were our best yet kicking off with <u>Bonjour, Paris</u>, our Paris Olympics-themed celebration at the MCG, <u>Parmas for Purpose</u> - our first-ever fundraising event—and other boutique gatherings like <u>SESF</u> on the <u>Greens</u> lawn bowls with our alumni, a Golf Day, a Virtual Golf Challenge, and an exclusive networking event at Sydney Tower.

At these events, we celebrated significant milestones, awarding **Brooke Buschkuehl** a life membership and naming **Anthony and Liz Phillips** as SESF's first-ever patrons. Each event was a great success and underscored SESF's growing presence and the strong community of supporters that make our mission possible.

Our alumni continue to inspire us with their achievements. **Jack Howell**, a 2016 SESF recipient and ambassador, proudly debuted as our first-ever Paralympian. **Bec Henderson**, a 2018 recipient and ambassador, became SESF's first dual Olympian after competing in both the Tokyo and Paris Olympics. We also celebrated **Harley Reid**, a 2017 recipient, who won Goal of the Year in his impressive first AFL season; **Jasper Stubbs**, a 2019 recipient, who made his Masters debut; and the return of the AFLW season with alumni **Monique Conti** (2014), **Maddy Prespakis** (2015), and **Gabby Newton** (2016) leading the way.

The SESF team is incredibly proud of this year's achievements and eager to reach new heights in 2025. Heartfelt thanks to the SESF Board and volunteers, whose dedication enables young athletes to overcome challenges and pursue their dreams. To our partners, supporters, and families—thank you for your unwavering commitment to making sport accessible. Wishing you all a joyful festive season and a successful new year!



The HOPE Survey

The Hope Survey, supported by The Phillips Foundation, Giving Connect, Resilient Youth Australia, and The University of Adelaide, has enabled us in 2024 to measure the transformative impact of SESF scholarships on youth. The survey assesses *hope*, *resilience*, *and life satisfaction*.

THIS IS WHAT WE FOUND:



- 38% of SESF females and 24% of males rate their Life Satisfaction at the highest level.
- 75.7% of SESF males and 81.3% of females are considered Resilient.
- 79% of SESF recipients report feeling Hopeful "most" or "lots" of the time.


"It made me feel as i was important and vauled and help relieved our financial problems."

SESF recipients told us our scholarships **REDUCE financial stress**, **BUILD confidence** and personal growth, and **OFFER a pathway** to future sporting opportunities.

JACK HOWELL MAKES HIS PARALYMPICS DEBUT

We are incredibly proud of Jack Howell, a 2016 SESF scholarship recipient, who recently made his debut at the 2024 Paris Paralympics in the Men's PTS5 Paratriathlon. At just 19 years of age, Jack is not only the youngest international competitor in the world rankings but also the youngest member of the Australian team. Jack finished an impressive 7th place, adding to an already stellar year!



BEC HENDERSON BECOMES A DUAL OLYMPIAN

Bec Henderson, 2018 alumni and SESF ambassador, made history as the first SESF alumni to become an Olympian, competing in the 20km Race Walk at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics at just 20 years old, finishing 38th. She has now become a dual Olympian, competing in both the 20km Race Walk and the Marathon Team Racewalk Relay at the Paris 2024 Olympics.



Harley Reid wins AFL Goal of the Year

Congratulations to Harley Reid, a 2017 SESF scholarship recipient, for winning Goal of the Year at the 2024 AFL Brownlow Awards. Harley has had an outstanding year since being picked No.1 in the 2023 AFL Draft by the West Coast Eagles. He made his much-anticipated debut in Round 1 against Port Adelaide and secured a nomination for the Rising Star Award for his impressive season.



Jasper Stubbs becomes a professional golfer

Jasper Stubbs has turned professional after his debut at the 2024 Masters, following a share of 32nd place in his title defense at the Asia Pacific Amateur Championship in Japan. The Victorian, who won the Asia-Pacific Amateur Championship in 2023, will begin his professional career with the 2024/25 Challenger PGA Tour of Australasia, becoming the first Australian AAC participant this year to make the switch.



AFLW stars continue to shine

Season 9 of the AFLW saw three SESF alumni take the field. Monique Conti (2014) continued to dominate the midfield for the Richmond Tigers after winning the 2023 Best and Fairest. Maddy Prespakis (2015), 2020 Best and Fairest winner, remained one of the top player for Essendon and the whole league. Gabby Newton (2016) began a new chapter with the Fremantle Dockers.
